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very scarce, a choice Collection of the most valuable Questions and Answers being Re-printed, under the Title of Athenian Oracles, (which with the Supplement now in the Press, make Four Volumes in large Octavo :) The Copies of which, Mr. Bell Purchas'd of me; and is all the Athenian Oracles he has any Right to; for in my Articles with Mr. Bell, (and that's the Reason I call this 6th Project Dunton's Apollo) I reserv'd to my self a Liberty of continuing my Athenian Oracle, as a Work absolutely necessary for all such as desire an Answer to such Curious Questions as were wholly omitted in the Old Oracles; And I hope in my Octavo Writings and Weekly Paper call'd Athenianism, and Athenian News, to furnish out such an Apollo, as will convince my Old Friends the Querists, that the Encouragement they have given to the British Apollo, has (as a just Reward of their Ingratitude to the first Projector of the Athenian Oracle) been to their own Loss, as they shall have (by adding the Continuation Oracle to the Four Oracles Printed for Mr. Bell) an Answer to all Nice and Curious Questions whatever, under the Title of Athenian Oracle; for I never will, nor never did (except it were through forgetfulness or Over-sight) meddle with a single Syllable of the Old Mercuries Printed for Mr. Bell; For Truth is as Infinite and Inexhaustible as the Eternal Unity; and for that Reason I shall write Dunton's Apollo, (or Continuation of the Athenian Oracle) to the End of my Life, and upon Subjects wholly New and Uncommon.

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PROJECT VIII.

*A Satyr upon King William*: Being the Secret History of his Life and Reign, extracted from the private Minutes that were taken by Collonel Babington, and other Persons of Quality: The Fourth Edition Corrected and Enlarg'd.

PROJECT IX.

*The weeping Elagy*: Or Tears to the Memory of his Dear Friend and School-fellow, Mr. Samuel Treacher, Lace-Man, who died at Chesham of the Small Pox; April 3. 1709, in the 50th Year of his Age: Intermix'd with an Essay upon Lawful Murder, or the Art of Man-killing, as practis'd by the Country Doctors.

PROJECT X.

*Double Hell*: Or an Essay on Despair; intermix'd with a Conference between the Famous Mr. John Dod, and Mr. Throgmorton (then lying upon his Death-bed under Desertion, being an Original Manuscript, that accidentally fell into the Hands of an Eminent Citizen, and was never Printed before. To which is added, a Narrative written by Mr. Goulart (a Famous French Author) of Five desperate Sinners; one of which dy'd wishing he was in Hell; and the rest declaring to the By-standers, they were certainly Damn'd; with an Appendix, shewing the great Use of Examples; but more especially of such as these.

*The He-Strumpets*: A Satyr on the Sodomite-Club: The Fourth Edition, Alter'd and much Enlarged.

PROJECT XII.

*The New Creation*: Or Dunton's Thoughts in a Fit of Sickness, upon those Words: Arise ye Dead, and come to Judgment; with Answers to some Nice and Curious Questions concerning the Time and Manner of the last Judgment; in which is advanc'd several New Notions, but more especially this, That Dooms-day (or the general Resurrection) is not so near as dreaded, and Asserted to be by Dr. Beverley and others.

PROJECT XIII.

*The Nightingale*: Or an Ode upon the Death of Mr. Henry Purcel, who (as 'tis hop'd) is gone to Heaven, where only his Harmony can be exceeded. The Second Edition; to which is added Mr. Purcel's Epitaph.

PROJECT XIV.

*A Narrative of the Scotch Commencement*: Or, an Account of what pass'd in the General Assemblies at Edinburgh, Glasgow and Aberdeen, at the late Promotion of Mr. Daniel Williams, Mr. Edmund Calamy, and Mr. Joshua Oldfield to the Degree of Dr. of Divinity; with a Character of the Scotch Professors; in a Letter to the Author of the
